Splunk Global Support provides the same services as defined as Enterprise support and also provides a dedicated resource to contact for meetings as frequently as weekly to monitor your support issues; to provide additional status reports and metrics; and to coordinate and execute a quarterly account status review at a mutually agreeable time.

The agreement will automatically renew for additional one (1) year terms (or for term purchased if different than one year) (each, a "Renewal Term," and the Initial Term, collectively with any and all Renewal Terms, shall be referred to as the "Support Term"), unless either party provides the other (or if purchased through a reseller, you provide reseller) with written notice of its intent not to renew the agreement at least thirty (30) days prior to the end of the then

current Initial Term or Renewal Term. If you allow your Support Term to expire, it must expire for all of your licenses. If you would like to re-instate Support, it must be re-instated for all of your licenses.
